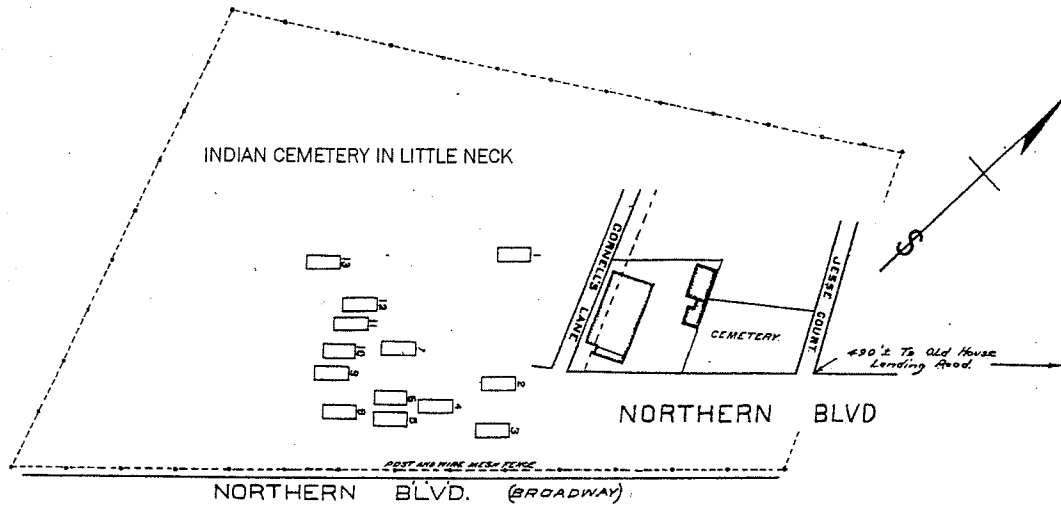


Dr. John Strong tells us about the evolution of Native American culture on Long Island.
